# In the Spotlight with: Dominique Davis

# The community demands accountability from SUHSD.

United we stand!





There has been a continuous outcry from the Black community within and surrounding Salinas Union High School District for those in systems to see us, to hear us and to take these recent racist events serious; serious enough to do something and use their power to uphold the oath of office that they took. But after various back-to-back blatant racist encounters (*black babydoll*, *Black History Month 23' incidents*) those cries seem to land on death ears. So what happens next? We show up and organize because people have power. On March 14th, 2023, local racial justice and equity organizers Pastor Artis Smith and Tamisha L. Allen Smith, to name a few,

led the Black & Brown community to collectively speak up at SUHSD's board meeting to make their voices heard against fighting racism & discrimination. But it doesn't end here. So how can you support? Please read a letter from *Lyndon Tarver*, *President*, *NAACP Monterey County Branch #1049*:

"The next Salinas Unified High School District board meeting will be held on April 11 at 6:30pm - District Office 431 W Alisal St in Salinas. The NAACP encourages attendance at this meeting. If you wish to address the Board, please complete the Speaker Request Form prior to the commencement of the meeting, available at the door, and return it to the Administrative Assistant.

Individual speakers shall be allowed 3 minutes to address the Board. Speakers will be recognized under the "Individuals Desiring to Address the Board" portion of the agenda."

For those of you who would like to communicate with individual board members about specific concerns, please find their names and email addresses by selecting this link.

The support for our Black and Brown Students, Faculty, and Staff who are targeted with racism, inflammatory words and action that doesn't address the inequities within the Salinas school district/board. We are advocating for the guardian of equality to attend the school boards meetings and voicing on concerns and displeasure of the ongoing demands to adequately address the traumatic morale of minorities attending and employed by the Salinas school district.

Additionally, the EPIC Failure of the DIversity and Inclusion Training demonstrates the management and leadership isn't interested in the education, health, and welfare of the minority Students, Faculty, and or Staff within the district."






